ENCORE Kick-Off

On July 5th and 6th, the official kick-off of the project ENCORE took place. ENCORE stands for **ENriching Circular use of OeR for Education**. The partnership is composed of 13 European partners - including EADTU - and is coordinated by the University of Pisa. The project will contribute to the teaching and recognition of the skills most relevant to the new macro-trends of digitalization, climate change and post-COVID economic recovery challenges.

ENCORE aims, amongst others, to help students and workers acquire the skills to face economical, ecological, and technological challenges; address the skills mismatch between the demand of companies and the supply of educational institutions, and support educators to be aligned with the ever-evolving landscape of relevant skills.

Common Microcredential Framework

Common Microcredential Framework - update

The Common Microcredential Framework (CMF) is now an official EU trademark. CMF is developed by the [European MOOC Consortium](#) and EADTU. The label can be awarded to high-quality microcredential courses and programmes with academic credit.

POWERHEAD final conference – save the date

The European project POWERHEAD (Empowering Higher Education in Adopting Digital Learning) explores how to sustainably integrate digitalisation in higher education. On Monday 17 October 2022, the project will host its final conference in Brussels, Belgium.

During this conference, the project partners will present the gathered insights on digital learning and teaching in higher education, and share the developed guidelines and recommendations aimed to inspire both national authorities and higher education institutions (HEIs). Furthermore, they will look at the next steps that can be taken by various actors involved.

A pilot study of UOC (Universitat Oberta de Catalunya), uses artificial intelligence to detect the needs of students in a remote learning

A pilot study of the use of artificial intelligence to detect the needs of students in remote learning has concluded that the data obtained can be used by teachers to offer help to the students who most need it. The research, carried out in conjunction with the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya (UOC), the Eurecat technological centre and the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, will help solve one of the biggest problems faced by off-site education, which has become more widespread during the pandemic: how to obtain information concerning the progress of students in order to provide them with the necessary support before it is too late.

Some of the keys to improving learning through feedback

It is something almost all students have experienced: the teacher of a course sets a date for a task to be handed in, the student does it, hands it in, and after a while, they receive a specific grade together with the corrections.
