EADTU–EU Summit 2018 ‘Innovations in blended and online education and virtual mobility’

On the 17th of April the 6th EADTU–EU Summit was organised to bring together stakeholders in Higher Education (HE) on ‘Innovations in blended and online education and virtual mobility’.

The Summit was attended by participants from the European Commission, members of the European Parliament, members of the national delegations for the EU, university networks and other stakeholders (enterprises, social partners).

The main topics addressed were:

- * Towards a European maturity model for blended degree education
- * The European MOOC Consortium (EMC) and how MOOCs can have an impact on the European labour market
- * The second Envisioning report of EMPOWERING universities in the uptake of new modes of teaching and learning
- * A new Virtual Erasmus approach
- * The changing pedagogical landscape 2018, 2nd edition
- * EADTU’s Mobility Matrix, distinguishing characteristics between Physical, Virtual and Open Virtual Mobility models

The closing panel session by Vanessa Debiais (EU, head of unit higher education), Michael Gaebel (EUA) and Catherine Mongenet (FUN) was focusing specifically on continuous education / continuous professional development and MOOCs as part of the European Higher Education Area.

Continuous education/CPD; the entrepreneurial university is highlighted as well as enhancing career practitioners' competencies in the use of ICT.

We trust this 2nd edition of the EMPOWER Envisioning Report will be a source of inspiration for many innovators in education.

EADTU's position paper on lifelong learning

EADTU prepared a position paper concerning lifelong learning and the development of the Bologna Process and the European Area of Higher Education. On the 17th of April 2018, this document was discussed on the EADTU–EU Summit with delegates of EUA and the European Commission and it is approved by the General Assembly of EADTU. Besides degree education, the universities organise continuous education, continuous professional development and open education (MOOCs, OER). These sectors are still underdeveloped in many European countries, about failing to reach the ET2020 objectives (See the EU Education and Training Monitor), while they have to meet the new educational needs in the economy and in society.

[EUA responds to Digital Education Action Plan](#)

On 17 January 2018, the European Commission issued its “Digital Education Action Plan” – the EU’s first major intervention in the field of digital education since the 2013 “Opening up Education” Communication. The Plan proposes concrete measures, such as establishing a Europe-wide platform for digital higher education and enhanced cooperation, a digital connection between universities’ information systems and a European student card. ["Bologna digital"- Strengthening the European Higher Education Area through Technology Enhanced Solutions](#)

Digitalisation should not be viewed as an additional challenge, but as a powerful means to meet existing challenges for higher education. This is the main argument of the position paper “[Bologna Digital](#)”, a joint initiative coordinated by Kiron and supported by several other higher education stakeholders, including [Hochschulforum Digitalisierung \(HFD\)](#), [FiBS Research](#), the [European Association of Distance Teaching Universities \(EADTU\)](#) and the [Groningen Declaration Network \(GDN\)](#). It was published online ahead of the [EHEA Ministerial Conference in Paris in May 2018](#), a summit of education and science ministers from the 48 member states of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). “Bologna Digital” provides 17 concrete recommendations. Examples include the provision of online introductory courses, the establishment of standardised processes for the evaluation and recognition of qualifications acquired through different (open) online formats, the development of quality assurance mechanisms for digital teaching and learning, and opportunity for virtual student exchange. connects the recommendations of “Bologna Digital” with existing examples of good practice.



[EFFECT Webinar on inclusivity and citizenship skills](#)

This webinar explores new ways of using social theories of learning, in particular adapting Engestrom’s ‘Change Laboratory’ approach to address inclusivity and citizenship in the context of increasingly diverse student and staff communities. The session will be highly interactive and will help the attendees recognise ‘the problem’ even when the issues are not ‘hot topics’ for them. The starting point for the online discussions will be stimulus ‘mirror’ data, extracted from students and staff feedback, video material and scenarios drafted from sometimes surprising contributions to earlier face to face workshops.
