
LTLO is a public offering from Athabasca University, Canada's Open University. Athabasca University is committed to offering affordable, high quality, inclusive education.

The University of Derby Online Learning is pleased to announce that all MOOCs are now provided through the D2L/Brightspace platform. The move from Canvas to D2L/Brightspace reflects the desire to shift from tutor-led design to learner-led design. We currently have three MOOCs live with more scheduled. We opened our *Understanding Autism, Asperger's & ADHD* (AAA) course at the end of March and we now have 8200 learners engaged. *Depression: A Compassionate View* has over 1200 learners and *Bridging the Dementia Divide: Supporting People Living with Dementia* has almost 600 learners.
