

This model embraces all levels of an institution: the design of blended courses, organisational aspects such as staff support, training and institutional leadership, next to policy development and strategies which enable an institution to innovate continuously its blended education, teaching and learning.

### BUKA Project receives European funding

In partnership with Tampere University of Applied Sciences (lead), the National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) at Dublin City University (DCU) was successful in securing almost €1m of external funding for the BUKA project intended to promote equity and access to higher education through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) in Malaysia, the Philippines and Indonesia. ### Accessibility is part of service in JYUOpen

**Sanna Nuutinen** is studying multidisciplinary family studies online at the Open University of the University of Jyväskylä. Nuutinen's narrow vision enables reading to certain extent and an inner ear implant helps her to hear.

"It is not difficult to acknowledge accessibility, but it must be designed and implemented carefully. I continuously come across fancy websites that not everyone can read. For example, contrast, font, colours, richness and structure affect readability," says Nuutinen.

"The question is about equality and opportunity to use services. Accessibility requires both technical and pedagogical solutions," says **Tarja Ladonlahti**, the coordinator of the accessibility (ESA) subproject of the DigiCampus project.
