MOOCs for the labour market: a new knowledge alliance

On the 23rd of January, EADTU's EMC-LM project kicked off with all major European MOOC platforms (Futurelearn, France Université Numérique, Miriadax, EduOpen, OpenupEd), European public employment services, sectoral training organisations and companies. All platforms produce MOOCs which are suitable for the labour market, but also fragmented along different languages, topics, level and size, crediting, etc.

The alliance brings together European key players with a diverse spectrum of expertise: MOOC platforms, universities, employment services, companies and networks to join forces and use cross–sectoral and cross–border approaches to MOOCs.

The Pan-Commonwealth Forum: A joint Celebration

The Open University will be co-hosting the ninth Pan-Commonwealth Forum (PCF9) on Open Learning with the Commonwealth of Learning (COL) from 9–12 September 2019. Celebrating COL's 30th Anniversary and the OU's 50th Anniversary year, the Forum will be held at the historic BT Murrayfield Stadium in Edinburgh. The focus of PCF9 will

be Innovations for Quality Education and Life-long Learning, and will discuss, debate and showcase how innovations are improving the quality of education and creating new spaces for life-long learning. Sub-themes will run through the event programme, to include Opening up Education, Increasing employability skills, Equity and inclusion, and Technology.

Non-degree programs at Anadolu University

Anadolu University offers a broad range of non-degree programs (e-certificate programs and open courses) in distance mode, along with degree programs.

Anyone with a high school diploma can get enrolled in an e-certificate program and choose from among over 50 courses. On the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the University, e-certificate programs have been diversified in 2019.

AKADEMA is a platform launched to offer MOOCs for learners from any background. AKADEMA currently offers 56 courses including cello playing, basketball, scuba diving, 21st century citizenship, body language, CV writing, photography, game theory, project-based learning, Arabic, Turkish, and social network analysis.

From the beginning of 2019, Tampere University of Applied Sciences (TAMK) and Tampere University constitute Finland's most diverse university community. Tampere higher education community has more than 30.000 students and close to 4.400 employees.

The president of Tampere University is Mari Walls, and the president of TAMK is Markku Lahtinen. The two institution types (universities and UASs) continue to act under different legislation. Tampere higher education community has 38 English-taught master's programmes.

National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) Celebrates 5th Birthday

In January, the National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) at Dublin City University (DCU) celebrated its 5th Birthday. The NIDL was established with a mission to be a world leader at the forefront of digital models of education to help transform lives and societies. During a special event to mark the occasion, DCU's President, Professor Brian MacCraith shared his reflections on some the NIDL's major achievements over the past 5-years, including €4m generated from externally funded projects, more than 600 scholarly publications and being selected as the host of this year's ICDE World Conference on Online Learning. Global Online Learning Accelerator

In January, Dublin City University (DCU) was awarded over €1.4m under the Government's new Innovation and Transformation Projects Fund to establish the Irish Global Online Learning Accelerator (I–GOLA) initiative. This major initiative will enable DCU to expand and more fully harness the potential the open short courses and new credit earning pathways through innovative digital designs and online delivery models on a global stage. The Ideas Lab in DCU's National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) will manage the project. DCU is also a partner in another major project being led by the Irish Universities Association (IUA) that was awarded €2.9m to develop the digital capacity of staff and students for learning and teaching. Lastly, the NIDL will also lead a major new European funded project

(€2.3m) aimed at developing transversal skills and digital assessment strategies in the area of STEM education.



A visionary Master in Artificial intelligence

Artificial intelligence is a new turning point in the digitalization process of our society. All companies need a whole range of Al expertise. From this perspective, Distance University's Master in Artificial intelligence trains developers and future managers in Al. This Master is a visionary programme that combines theoretical tuition and an integrated job experience. Students develop a company's artificial intelligence (Al) and, at the same time, get a high-level, mostly online university training. This unique programme is the result of a strategic partnership between Swiss Distance University and Idiap research institute a national center of expertise in Al.
