# The Online, Open and Flexible Higher Education Conference 2017 (OOFHEC2017)

The "Online, Open and Flexible Higher Education Conference 2017" at the Open University in Milton Keynes was again a truly international event with some 30 countries represented. OOFHEC2017 on "Higher Education for the Future; Accelerating and Strengthening Innovation" was offering keynote and parallel sessions next to several interactive workshops with input from experts from all over Europe and beyond.

OOFHEC2017 demonstrated new developments in the sector for using new modes of teaching and learning. Highlighted topics were strategies for the future of continuous professional development, open education and widening participation, research and innovation for new modes of teaching and learning, HE for a diverse future, engaging students for learning at all stages of life, policies for change in Higher Education, quality assurance and accreditation of online and blended higher education and recognition.

#### EADTU-ENQA PLA on QA of blended and online education

On 21–22 September, the EADTU–ENQA Peer Learning Activity (PLA) on Quality Assurance in blended and online education took place in Brussels. In this highly interactive event, a total of 45 stakeholder representatives were brought together, coming from 18 universities, 12 quality assurance agencies and 6 governments and umbrella organisations. The stakeholders had a constructive dialogue towards awareness and new steps in the uptake of new modes of teaching. This PLA identified next steps in the development of blended and online degree and continuing education. The outcomes of this EADTU–ENQA PLA are now published and submitted to the Bologna Process.

## Launch of the European MOOC Consortium (EMC)

During the OOFHEC2017 Conference in Milton Keynes, EADTU launched the European MOOC Consortium (EMC). EMC represents organisations taking a lead in MOOCs in Europe. The founding partners (FutureLearn, France Université Numérique, OpenupEd, Miríada X and EduOpen) represent most of the MOOC development work in Europe in terms of learners and number of MOOCs, by offering together almost a 1000 MOOCs. Together, they represent a large network of 250 higher education institutions (HEIs) and companies working in a variety of European languages, including English, French, Spanish and Italian.

The European MOOC Consortium will strengthen the credibility of massive open online courses (MOOCs) as a learning approach in higher education by taking a leading role in developing the discourse relating to MOOCs and other innovative developments in online learning in Europe. A priority action line by EMC was the submission of the European MOOC Consortium statement with regard to the integration of MOOCs in the Bologna Process which can be found <u>here</u>.

European Maturity model for Blended Education (EMBED 2017-2020)

EADTU has started a project under Erasmus+ KA2 Strategic Partnerships on developing a European maturity model for blended education (EMBED). This strategic partnership coordinated by EADTU consists of frontrunner universities like Delft University, University of Edinburgh, KU-Leuven, DCU-Ireland, Aarhus University and TAMK-Finland. EMBED will introduce innovation in higher education by the implementation of blended education in the partnership and beyond.

We will create a reference model for developing and implementing blended education, embracing all levels of an institution: the design of the blended course, organisational aspects such as staff support and training, and institutional leadership, developing policies and strategies making the institution continuously innovative. The main goal is to launch a maturity model with criteria and instruments to assess the degree of maturity of blended education and innovation of a university and contribute to a deep change within the partnership and beyond. The evaluators considered the project innovative and an important contribution to enhance the current knowledge on the inclusion of persons with disabilities in higher education in Europe, able to be replicated to other countries and institutions.

# New book by OUC Professor Michalinos Zembylas

OUC Professor of <u>Educational Theory and Curriculum Studies</u> <u>Michalinos Zembylas</u> and Dr. Z. Bekerman of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem have published their new book titled "Psychologized Language in Education Denaturalizing a Regime of Truth".

The authors explore how psychologized language has come to dominate education and schooling, and focuses on the ways that normative language/vocabulary use works to shape students' and teachers' perceptions of identity and difference. Taking a critical lens to some major constructs in education and their grounding in psychologized discourses, the authors suggest possible ways to overcome these psychologized discourses and remedy their consequences.
