2nd Convention of the knowledge Alliance for the Labour Market

Micro-credentials and Bologna Key Commitments

This Microbol report, published earlier this week, presents the state of play of micro-credentials in the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) relative to six dimensions: their development, legislation, digitalisation, and the applicability to them of the existing Qualifications Frameworks (QFs) and European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS), recognition and Quality Assurance (QA).

The study is part of the "MICROBOL – Micro-credentials linked to the Bologna Key Commitments" project, co-funded by the Erasmus+ programme of the European Union, in which ministries and stakeholders involved in the Bologna Follow-up Group (BFUG) explore whether and how the existing EHEA tools can be used and/or adapted to be applicable to micro-credentials.

This European University Association (EUA) publication is the result of extensive consultations and deliberations with EUA members and partners over a six-month period in 2020. It sets out a vision of resilient and effective universities, serving Europe's societies towards a better future.

In particular, it focuses on sustainability, the importance of openness, the role of university missions and how to turn this vision into a reality.

The meeting was hosted by hosted by University of Zagreb. The 30-month project is funded under the Erasmus + program of the European Commission in the total amount of 296,845.00 euros. The goal of TEACH4EDU4 is to advance higher education in the fast-growing field of computer sciences, in order to enable the teaching in line with the modern innovative world trends in hybrid and international environments and the needs of Industry 4.0.

Digitally enhanced learning & teaching in European higher education institutions

In Europe today, almost every higher education institution uses digitally enhanced learning and teaching. Since EUA began exploring this topic in 2013, digitally enhanced learning and teaching has been further embraced by higher education institutions across Europe, with general acceptance growing and institutions widely acknowledging the benefits it brings to the student experience.

This second DIGI-HE publication, led by EUA in partnership with four universities, maps the situation regarding digitally enhanced learning and teaching at European higher education institutions over the past seven years. The report, which can be found here, aims to give readers insight into the strategic uptake of digitalisation, its impact and challenges in various areas of institutional life, expectations for the future, as well as changes accelerated by the current pandemic.


Last but not least, the organization of scientific conferences as well as the participation in research Forums of the Academic Community, further contribute to the research direction of Hellenic Open University."

On Wednesday 27 January the UNINETTUNO Rector Prof. Maria Amata Garito and the Rector of the Université Catholique de Lille Prof. Patrick Scauflaire, have signed the Double Degree academic agreement for the Master of Science in 'Business Management and Digital Technologies'. The program will be proposed with an innovative 'blended' approach combining some of the best European experiences in online teaching in e-learning mode (Uninettuno) and traditional teachting (the Université Catholique de Lille). The first year will be in e-learning mode through the UNINETTUNO teaching model, while the second year will be in presence at the Campus of the Catholic University of Lille.
